# **DELEGATION**

Dalyce Stubenberg presented Council with a petition from residents on Frances Avenue who are opposed to By-Law 18-16, being a By-Law to amend Zoning By-Law 15-07. Since the time of the Public Hearing, the YTG properties have been sold and removed from the market, so the residents on Frances Avenue agree that the By-Law should be repealed. Administration informed Ms. Stubenberg that the Public Hearing for the Zoning amendment took place August 7<sup>th</sup> and therefore the Town of Watson Lake will need to seek a legal opinion whether the petition is acceptable.

Barry Drury informed Council that although his intentions were to do something that he believed would be beneficial for the good of the community, he is withdrawing his request to change the zoning on his properties on Frances Avenue.

#### **REPORTS**

**CAO REPORT** 

Administration provided Council with an update on the evacuation order that became effective on August 19 for the residents of Lower Post due to the wildfire situation.

On 21 August 2018, Yukon Wildland Fire Management was asked by BC Wildfire Service to assume Incident Command for the fire. The fire was actioned by WFM and Watson Lake firefighters, supported by aviation assets. Structural protection was established and activated for vulnerable structures in the community, together with earth berms to re-direct the fire away from structures.

Residents have been received and registered at the reception centre established by Yukon Emergency Social Services in the Watson Lake Recreation Centre. Initial estimates indicate that 130-135 Lower Post residents have been affected.

The BC Wildfire Service has established a daily-scheduled meeting in the Watson Lake Recreation Centre, providing information for residents of Lower Post and Watson Lake about the fire.

Administration provided Council with current Financial reports and an explanation on revenues and expenses to date.

An Assessment Management review has been completed on the Town facilities and all facilities have been listed as poor, other than the Recycling Depot & Water Treatment Plant that received a good rating. Stantec will be conducting an assessment on both the Administration Building and Firehall for upgrades that need to be done.

Administration advised that the Town of Watson Lake has the ability under the Municipal Act to impose a tax levy on accommodations within the community. B&B's as well as RV Parks have been included in the By-Law. Council suggested a meeting with those business owners who will be affected by the Bylaw prior to the Bylaw proceeding to Second Reading.

## ADMINISTRATIVE ENQUIRIES

Councilor Leach enquired about the work being done on the Fireguards in Watson Lake. Administration advised that work to upgrade the southern fireguards is underway. The program is aimed at reducing the risk of forest fire. This will involve clearing flammable ground debris, removing ground cover, thinning and pruning, including the removal of standing dead and blown-down materials.

The Town of Watson Lake EMO Plan has been updated, however there is still plenty of work to be done and more information obtained before it will be complete.
