DELEGATION

Cheryl O'Brien, representing the Watson Lake Chamber of Commerce presented Council with concerns regarding the proposed changes to the Electoral boundaries that will encompass Watson Lake and Ross River and the negative effects this may have on the electoral district.

The position of the Chamber of Commerce is to allow Watson Lake to remain in its own electoral riding. A Public meeting is being held in Watson Lake on March 10^{th} with the Electoral Boundaries commission to discuss the proposal. The WL Chamber of Commerce is encouraging residents to attend.

STANTEC ENGINEERING

Representatives from Stantec Engineering provided Council with an overview of the Sewage Lagoon upgrades that are expected to commence in May.

CAO UPDATE

Administration informed Council that Minister Streicker of Community Services is planning a visit to Watson Lake on April 6th or 13th. It is anticipated that Minister Mostyn of YG Highways & Public Works will be available at the same time to meet with Council.

Ed Khran advised that a report is being prepared on the Watson Lake Hotel property that will be available in June.

The Water/Sewer Bylaw 16-07 was addressed. The Bylaw has been amended to include various definitions and the sewage dumping rate. The Institutional water rates were discussed and it was recommended to decrease the fee to \$2.25/litre otherwise the rate could be too excessive and create a financial hardship on those businesses. Council agreed to the decrease and review the rates next year for any changes.

Administration is working on preparing a bylaw that will consolidate all the fees & charges levied by the Town into one bylaw.

GOLDEN PREDATOR DONATION REQUEST

ADMINISTRATIVE ENQUIRIES

Councilor Bauer addressed the water & sewer freeze-ups that are occurring on Campbell Way and questioned the reasons that this may be occurring.

Council discussed the operational costs for the sewage lagoon. Unfortunately no estimate is available at this time. Staff will require training on operating the facility as new regulations are in place.

The Union Collective Agreement expires December 31,2018. The writ will be presented in June in anticipation of negotiations to begin in September. The Letter of Understanding for the Water Treatment plant operators has been approved by the Union.

The March 14th Public meeting will focus on the Town financial overview. Meaghen Stewart will be contracted to prepare information to be distributed at the meeting that addresses the budgets and proposed tax rate increases.

Administration has been in discussion with Liard First Nation regarding the outstanding amounts owed to the Town. LFN agreed to discuss this matter further and are expected to have an answer next week as to the monies that will be forthcoming to the Town to apply to their debt. LFN has agreed to purchase 130 of the extra garbage containers that the Town has in storage.

Administration informed Council of upcoming meetings that are taking place throughout the month of March.
